INVITATION

The Organizing Committee cordially invites grape researchers from India and abroad to participate in the **International Dialogue on “Indian Viticulture: Way Forward”** jointly organized by Society for Advancement of Viticulture and Enology (SAVE), Pune, and ICAR-National Research Centre for Grapes, Pune India during 15-16 November, 2019. The primary aim of this dialogue is to provide a platform for the grape researchers, academicians, policy makers and young researchers/students to discuss and exchange ideas to plan research activities for grape under Indian conditions considering future demands, climate change regime, pressure on natural resources, vines for future, etc. We hope that your participation will make this international event a great success.

THE DIALOGUE

India is an emerging leader as table grape producer on world arena, and is exporting grapes to more than 70 countries. Grape export fetched 295 million USD during 2017-18 which is in increasing trend. However, to remain internationally competitive and to supply quality grapes to domestic consumers round the year, a number of strategic interventions will be required. Narrow varietal base, hot and dry conditions, less and poor quality of irrigation water, weather aberrations, disease and pest pressure, higher input cost, narrow production window are major restricting factors in quality grape production and high returns in India as well as in other tropical regions. The proposed dialogue aims to attract new ideas as well as refine the existing ones to meet the perceived challenges in coming times. The dialogue will help grape researchers and policy makers for long term as well as short term planning for strategic, basic and applied research.

- Climate resilience: Strategies and tools
- Plant health management: Futuristic approaches
- Postharvest, processing and food safety: Issues and challenges
- Scientists-Industry Interface

CALL FOR EVENT

The experts from different areas will be invited to discuss the challenges considering futuristic viticulture. Besides, grape researchers are also invited to submit their abstract for oral and poster presentation. The abstracts received before 25th September, 2019 will be screened and the selected abstracts will be included in the Book of abstract. The abstract (not exceeding 250 words) should include: title, names of all the authors, affiliation e-mail id of the corresponding author. The name of presenting author should be underlined. Abstract must be formatted in Microsoft Office Word with Times New Roman (font size 12pt with 1.5 spacing on A4 size with 1.5 cm top and bottom. 3.0 cm right and left margin). The abstract may be sent to idiv@save2013.in till 25th September 2019. The official language of the event will be English.

POSTER PRESENTATION

The poster must be of 1.0 x 1.2 m maximum size and should include title, name and address of the author(s), short introduction, method and material, results and conclusions. Best poster in each session will be awarded.
